- The Art Therapy Studio partnered with FRONT International 2022 during their Cleveland Triennial for Contemporary Art from July 16 – October 2. Art Therapy Studio Client-Artists Linda D.L. Green and Scott Mars showed their work at the FRONT PNC Exhibition Hub at Transformer Station, along with a historical display of Art Therapy Studio memorabilia. ATS Art Therapists also offered public programs to the community for free.
- We are so proud to announce that our Clinical Director, Cheryl Pete, became the Legislative Chair for the Buckeye Art Therapy Association (BATA) in 2022. This group has been leading the charge in advocating for art therapy licensure in the State of Ohio for over 40 years. Art Therapy Studio has long been a part of the fight to make art therapy a licensed field in the State of Ohio, and in July of 2023 this became a reality!



OUR MISSION Enhancing the quality of life for all people through art therapy.

WHAT DOES ART THERAPY STUDIO DO?

We develop relationships and facilitate art interventions between qualified art therapists and our client-artists to activate the clinically proven beneficial healing powers of artmaking. We use a strengthsbased, trauma informed approach to empower those we serve to reach their full potential.

HOW DO WE ACCOMPLISH THIS?

We employ board certified/credentialed art therapists to work with individuals and collaborate with community partners, responding to the unique needs of our diverse community by providing therapy that promotes mindfulness, emotional intelligence, and social connections.

HOW DO WE RESPOND TO THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY?

ATS works to make mental health resources via creative arts therapies accessible and affordable to those who would not otherwise receive these services. BIPOC, disabled, LGBTQ+, low-income, and other marginalized individuals have disproportionate history of trauma. Programming for these at-risk communities is our mission focus, and we offer need-based fee reductions, recognizing that financial limitations often create barriers to participation.

HOW DO WE BECOME A MORE INCLUSIVE ORGANIZATION?

This past year, in an effort to expand the cultural competency of the field of art therapy, ATS, in cooperation with our Racial Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Committee, developed the *Mickie McGraw Fellowship to Diversify the Field of Art Therapy.* This same year we hired our first Fellow, Michelle "Star" Starling to assist with providing art therapy to students within the CMSD school system. We continue to work with our REDI Advisory Committee to work towards a more equitable organization.
